The memorial service was held on June 15<sup>th</sup>, 2015, at the grave yard of Gen. Choi Hong Hi in the Patriotic Martyrs' Cemetery in Pyongyang.











Participants laid the flowers and floral wreathes in the name of ITF, Korean TKD Committee, IMGC, on the grave and paid a one minute silent tribute to the memory of Gen. Choi Hong Hi. Prof. Chang Ung made a memorial address.



## Memorial Address (Integral text presented by Prof. Dr. Chang UNG)

Dear Taekwon-Doists and people concerned attending this ceremony! Today we have an opportunity to pay deep respect to the Late Gen. Choi Hong Hi on the occasion of the 13<sup>th</sup> Year Memorial Service for him who is the first President of the International TKD Federation and the teacher of all the Taekwon-Doists of the whole world.



Meeting this day full of pain of parting we come to remember Gen. Choi Hong Hi who devoted all his life to TKD.

Gen. Choi Hong Hi who was born on Novemeber 9<sup>th</sup>, 1918, in Ryongwon ri, Hwatae county, N. Hamgyong Prov., Korea, keenly feeling the sorrow of the

enslaved nation from his early childhood, cherished an ambition to demonstrate the resourcefulness and talent of the Korean nation to the world. With that ambition and after decades of experience and labored study Gen. Choi Hong Hi at last founded Taekwon-Do associated with the firm mettle and soul of the Korean nation.

Gen. Choi Hong Hi who founded TKD on April 11<sup>th</sup>, 1955, 60 years ago, exerted all his efforts to develop TKD into a more scientific martial art and to promote it to the entire humankind.
